



# ST. ALBANS POLICE DEPARTMENT

## ANNUAL CRIME COMPARISONS JULY 1, 2013 THRU JUNE 30, 2014

### FISCAL YEAR 2014

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#### **During the Fiscal year 2014 the St. Albans Police Department:**

- ◆ Responded to 12,012 calls for police service. 3,591 calls for Police Service in the Town of St. Albans and 8,421 calls for Police Services in the City.
  - St. Albans Town incidents represent 32.7% of the total calls for service handled by the St. Albans Police Department in fiscal year 2014.

- ◆ Made 656 Arrest (Town and City)

- 187 Arrest were in the **Town** of St. Albans (Represents 40.1% of total arrest). Of which:
  - 166 were Adults
  - 21 were Juveniles

Of the Adult Arrest:

- 102 were Males
- 61 were Females

- 469 Arrest were in the **City** of St. Albans (Represents 59.9% of total arrest)
  - 429 were Adults
  - 43 were Juveniles

Of the Adult Arrest:

- 301 were Males
- 122 were Females

- ◆ Took 156 public inebriates into protective custody (Detox) [Town and City]
    - 20 Public Inebriates were in the **Town** of St. Albans ( Represents 13% of total)
    - 130 Public Inebriates were in the **City** of St. Albans (Represents 87% of total)
      - 111 were Male (71%)
      - 45 were Female (29%)
  
  - ◆ Conducted 3,950 Motor Vehicle stops, which resulted in 2,668 (68%) Warnings and 1,282 (32%) Traffic Tickets.
    - 883 tickets were issued in the City of St. Albans (69%)
    - 399 tickets were issued in the Town of St. Albans (31%)
    - 2,003 M.V. infraction Warnings were issued in the City of St. Albans (75%)
    - 665 M.V. infraction Warnings were issued in the Town of St. Albans (25%)
  
  - ◆ Conducted 351 (Documented) foot patrols in and around the downtown business district and in the Town of St. Albans (I.E.; Highgate Shopping Center, Price Chopper Shopping Plaza, Franklin Park West, Cohan Park, Bay Park, etc.).
    - 319 were in the City (91%)
    - 32 were in the Town (9%)
  
  - ◆ St. Albans Police Officers attended 2,968 hours of mandatory (in-service) and/or specialized training in criminal justice, enhanced areas of law enforcement related fields (I.E.; Death Investigation Training, Tactical Entry Training, Interview and Interrogation training, etc.), emergency services and National NIMS and ICS required training.
  
  - ◆ Performed specialized policing and security details for:

August is the busiest month of the year, in both the City and the Town and the busiest time of day is between 2:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. daily.

The Two School Resource Officers were in SATEC and BFA on 359 separate days during the past Fiscal Year.

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# CENTRAL DISPATCH REGIONAL DISPATCH & E911 CALL CENTER

During the past twelve (12) months Central Dispatch was responsible for alerting, and providing emergency communications for 25,037 Police, Fire and Rescue calls throughout Franklin and Grand Isle Counties and the Town of Westford, Vermont. Central Dispatch also handled 15,482 E-911 Calls and 84,911 informational and contact telephone calls. There were many more occasions where Central Dispatch provided radio testing, training and less formal emergency communications services, telephone and radio, to these same Emergency Entities.

Collectively Central Dispatch handled 125,430 Police, Fire and EMS emergency and informational of calls in Fiscal year 2014.
